

Bleakhouse Primary School**Pupil Premium Funding Academic Year 2021-2022 IMPACT REPORT****What is the Pupil Premium?**

The Pupil Premium was introduced in April 2011 and is additional funding the school receives to be used to close the gap in attainment, nationally, between pupils eligible for free school meals (FSM) and those from more affluent backgrounds.

Each school is able to decide how the money they receive is spent.

What are the barriers to learning at Bleakhouse Primary School?

Low aspirations; parental confidence in how to support their child with learning; underdeveloped learning behaviours; poor vocabulary and comprehension skills; limited resilience; sustaining concentration during lessons and assessments; poor self-esteem; EAL; disorganised home-life and fear of failure.

Pupils made good progress because they know how to improve their learning. Regular pupil conferences take place in which the teacher is released to speak to all pupils (including disadvantaged pupils) about their learning. Targets and interventions are reviewed as part of this process and the conference informs the Parent Evening that follows. This discussion includes a focus on the gap between achievement and ARE and how parents can support diminishing the difference. Those disadvantaged children, who receive interventions, have an individual impact report that highlights, support, interventions and progress made.

Reading and Maths outcomes will be closer to or in line with National Averages
As a result of the pandemic and the recovery strategy, the school has received additional funding to support pupils in catching up on lost learning opportunities. These include; the use of the School-based Tutoring Scheme (NTP), (whereby a tutor visits school to support identified children.		This is funded up to 75% by the DfE (£11,745) and topped-up from the school's budget)	This funding targets small groups of children and allows for lost learning and gaps in knowledge to be addressed.	Early impact analysis yields a positive impact on pupils' learning. For example, of the 11 pupils involved in Y4 Reading, 91% improved their standardised score with an average uplift of 7.73 points. Of the 9 pupils involved in Y5 Reading, 67% improved their standardised score with an average uplift of 5.44 points. In Writing, this Y5 group improved with 78% making 12months worth of progress. The NTP sessions were for 15 hours per pupil.
