### **Physical Development**

Can copy some letters and numbers Use simple tools (breaking into the ice to rescue the trapped animals of characters).

Use apparatus – under, on, over, around – when going on a 'Bear Hunt' Jump off apparatus safely.

Learn to put coat on independently.

#### CAL

Listen to stories with increased attention and recall. Join in with key events and phrases, e.g. I'll huff and puff...

Use talk in play when retelling fairy tales.

Use a camera to take photos of winter animals (toys) in frozen settings (dioramas).

#### **Expressive Arts and Design**

Uses various construction materials when building the Three Little Pigs houses. Explore materials and resources to create a Frozen World diorama.

Chooses particular colour for a purpose (hot or cold colours). Cold art display. Build stories around toys




# **Understanding of the World**

Ask questions about the natural world – how do animals survive in cold conditions?

Talk about animals and the environment (hot and cold places). Sort animals into two groups – hot or cold habitats.

Look closely at similarities, differences, patterns and changes. How are penguins different from lions? How is a polar bear similar to a panda?



## **PSED**

To play in a group, building up role-play with others. Retell traditional fairy tales using drama or a selection of toys and puppets.

Talk about our feelings and how our actions affect others.
